Black Mountain Elementary School visits state capitol; trip made possible by Target grant

Black Mountain Elementary School's fifth grade class travelled to Frankfort, KY on March 17th to visit the Kentucky State Capitol, the Thomas D. Clark Center for Kentucky History, the Governor's Mansion, and the gravesite of Daniel Boone.

Black Mountain Elementary social studies teacher Kenny Hughes applied for and received a \$700 Target Field Trip Grant that covered the costs of transportation and dinner at Gatti's restaurant for all 39 students. Student Trevor Nantz said, "I enjoyed the Kentucky Military Exhibit at the history museum because it showcased a couple from Evarts, Kentucky who served in the Vietnam War; Marcus and Martha Davis."

Mr. Hughes also remarked, "The trip was a wonderful experience for my students and I hope they remember it for years to come. I thank the people at Target for the grant they provided for this trip and also Representative Nelson for guiding us around the capitol building."
